## Photodisintegrations using High Energy $\gamma$ -beam at HI $\gamma$ S: Endeavours to Address the Few and the Many

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High Intestity  $\gamma$ -ray Source (HI $\gamma$ S) of Triangle Universities Nuclear Laboratory (TUNL) is the most intense source of monoenergetic  $\gamma$ -beam in the world. HI $\gamma$ S, thus, presents diverse experimental possibilities with relevance in a multitude of domains ranging from few-body physics, nuclear astrophysics, nuclear structure studies and photo-activation measurements. In this presentation, we shall discuss two different experiments on the cross-section measurements of  $\gamma$ -induced reactions. One of them is the  ${}^4{\rm He}(\gamma,p){}^3{\rm H}$  photodisintegration reaction that is of significance in the domain of few-nucleon physics, for instance, in the understanding of the three-nucleon force. The other is the  ${}^{86}{\rm Kr}(\gamma,n){}^{85}{\rm Kr}$  reaction which is important for probing the s-process branching point at  ${}^{85}{\rm Kr}$  that has a profound impact on the s-process modelling in Asymtotic Giant Branch (AGB) stars.
